Together we have served our local community under the common banner of rugby league. As we set our sights on a promising season ahead, I want to express my appreciation for the pivotal role each CBDRLRA member plays in fostering the growth of the sport within our vibrant local community. The Bulldogs, as we often emphasise, transcend being just an NRL team; we represent a symbol of unity across our diverse community. Rugby League has the power to connect and unite so many diverse cultures, religions, and backgrounds. It's park football that can create lifelong memories, drive connectivity, help form healthy lifestyle patterns and create a sense of community and belonging amongst our players, their families, and friends. You can speak to any first-grade player and they will reflect so fondly on the junior rugby league years that formed the very start of their career.

While the CBDRLRA and Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs have always worked together to ensure that our local football competition remains healthy, I am extremely pleased to say that this year will be a very special one indeed. This year, the Bulldogs together with Canterbury League Club have committed to championing access to junior rugby league through our new registration grant subsidy. The grant seeks to eliminate barriers for families to enter their children in the sport in the local area, increase participation numbers and help young families across the district enjoy regular engagement in community sports. As a community Club with an all-encompassing culture, these are the sorts of opportunities we pride ourselves on delivering. While we hope to welcome hundreds into the Bulldogs family and our competition-fold through this initiative, we do need to recognise and thank the CBDRLRA for their endless support which makes growth opportunities like this possible. Collectively, we are paving the way for young athletes in our district to pursue their dreams. Your continued support, efforts, and encouragement are crucial

in creating an environment that ensures sustained success, both on and off the field.

As we grow our participation numbers, so too will we grow and cultivate an even stronger, local talent pool in both male and female players. With a renewed commitment to ensuring the Bulldogs remain a premier development Club, the experiences of these young players will help form the next generation of the Bulldogs.

With a full and strong pathway in the males' space from junior league to the NRL, we are also actively working on creating a clear and visible pathway from junior league to the NRLW for our budding young female players. We eagerly await a response from the ARL and NRL regarding our NRLW submission, but in the interim our development programs continue with the view to not only be competition ready as and when we gain a licence but to be a fully competitive team on entry. What a milestone this will be for our great Club when the first females run out in the blue-and-white in the NRLW. It will be a new chapter to the incredible legacy that is the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs.

Last season we achieved an incredible four grand finals across the Tarsha Gale Cup, Harold Matthews Cup, Jersey Flegg Cup and Harvey Norman Women's Premiership sides: a testament to the strength of our pathway programs and staff. Our Harold Matthews and Jersey Flegg sides each won the Premiership Cup, and our Club won the NSWRL Flowers Memorial Pennant and Club Championship for the most aggregate points across all grades. This is an incredible feat that we should all be so proud of.

As we continue to go from strength to strength on the field, so too is our Club making great strides off the field. 2023 was a record year for the Club on a number of fronts, from our Membership number soaring to well over 20,000, our Corporate and Merchandise Programs hitting a record high, and our Football Club Members choosing to back the management of the Club affording us great unity and stability to continue to progress towards our vision of sustained excellence. The Club also continues to work on the development of a new Centre-of-Excellence to be built at Belmore Sports Ground — something our area has long deserved. This new facility will host our NRL and future NRLW teams under one roof, provide great benefits to all our Academy programs and act as a community hub for the local area.

On the field, and although we are off the back of a challenging season in 2023, strong recruitment, greater depth, and the buy in from our players and staff as we look towards 2024, convince me that our trajectory is upward.

I truly believe that if you have the right people in place, the results will come and I am confident that the individuals we have recruited, both on and off the field, will be the driving force behind our resurgence. Likewise, with the expected growth of our junior league, the collective efforts of all our active members from the Association and the CBDJRL are what will continue to make local football thrive in our area.

PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD

At the start of season 2023 little did we know that our year would end with the outstanding achievement of Life Member, Adam Gee being appointed to referee the Telstra NRL Grand Final between the Panthers and Broncos. The last member to be appointed to such a match was David Abood as a Touch Judge in 2009. Adam's impressive performance was acknowledged by all, including the media, fans and NRL hierarchy as one of the great refereeing performances which greatly contributed to a wonderful match. Adam also was appointed in October to referee the Australia v New Zealand test in Melbourne followed by the final of the Pacific Championship in NZ, where he continued with his excellent form.

Adam commenced his refereeing journey with CBRA at 14 years old, and early on it was evident that he had above average ability. He was the youngest referee to be appointed to a district A grade grand final in 2004 and received a similar appointment the year after. Adam was elevated to grade status in 2007 and to date has refereed 238 NRL matches, 9 Test fixtures, 3 World Cup matches as well as the 2017 Women's World Cup Final. Adam has now established himself as the NRL number 1 referee and we look forward to watching him in 2024 build on his impressive record.

I'm sure all would agree that Adam is a strong supporter of CBRA who continues to serve on our committee despite his numerous NRL commitments. Also, it is appropriate that Adam's wife Shannon and parents Warren and Annette should be acknowledged for their love and support to Adam which without doubt assisted him during his refereeing journey. Kim and I were extremely proud to be invited by Adam to join him in the sheds following the Grand Final to witness him being presented with a game ball by NRL CEO Andrew Abdo. Adam remains very humble and a true friend to many members of CBRA. It was a very proud moment in our modern history to have the NRL Number 1 referee, among our ranks. Well done my friend!

On the district front we had a season uninterrupted by wet weather and I offer my congratulations to all those active members who received Grand Final appointments, in particular Jabril Daizli who was appointed to his second successive Clubb Johnson Grand Final as our No 1 district referee.

Our graded members, Nathan Loveday and Jack Bird continue to toil away and

Nathan followed up his debut NSW Cup centre in 2022, with another 4 centre appointments throughout the 2023 season. Also, congratulations to Nathan and Karissa on tying the knot in October.

The Committee decided early in 2023 to alter our established social calendar and we had our first Life Members and Sponsors lunch, with 60 attendees' mid-season which was very successful. Our major function was moved to October and renamed as our 'First National Daystar Blue & White Presentation Dinner'. At this function with 110 members and guests we had our 90th Life Member presentation to Kane Thorburn, a very worthy recipient. Kane's contribution both on and off the field in his 11 years as a member is outstanding. All our other awards were presented on this night and are outlined elsewhere in the Annual Report. But it would be remiss if I did not thank the Committee for nominating me to receive my second Leo Randle Award, I was very surprised but very honoured.

At our 2023 AGM I announced that the Committee had elevated Mr George Coorey to the status of Honorary Member for Life. George held positions on both the Football and League Club Board for many years and was a current Patron of CBRA. George was a wonderful supporter of CBRA, no request from myself was ever declined and he regularly attended our meetings and social functions. George spoke on the night of his pride in receiving the acknowledgement of his service and was aware that a presentation would be forthcoming later in 2023.

George had not been in the best of health but in a shock to us all, he passed away suddenly on 17th August. It was an honour for the Association to host Laurel Coorey and her family at our presentation dinner and to give a small memento in memory of our friend George Coorey.

It's my pleasure to provide a report for the 2023 season.

The 2023 season was successful on many fronts, none more so than the achievements of Adam Gee.

Adam's appointment to the 2023 NRL Grand Final was a fantastic reward for his consistency and hard work not only throughout the season, but over many years. Whilst maintaining an extremely busy schedule with his NRL commitments, Adam still regularly attends meetings, social functions, and the odd training session to give back to our members. Adam is also still a current member on our committee, which he has been for several years.

Not only was it a wonderful achievement to be appointed to the game, but Adam's performance will go down as one of the best refereeing performances in an NRL Grand Final.

Winding back to the start of the season, our AGM was held at the home of our Major Sponsor, Canterbury League Club on Thursday 23rd February.

Junior League

Thank you again to John Grealy, Barry Ward, and the entire staff at the Junior League for their efforts in 2023.

This year we were lucky enough to host 4 weekends of Grand Finals at Belmore Oval, which whilst this was a positive in allowing plenty of opportunities for our members, this meant four very long weekends of game days @ Belmore Oval for the Junior League staff.

We have built up a wonderful relationship with the Junior League over the past few seasons, and we look forward to working again with John and Barry to ensure our Junior League continues to grow.

Membership & Meetings

This year the Association held 8 meetings (including the AGM) with an average attendance of 31. We as a committee are continuing to look at ways to increase attendance at our meetings, which whilst they are informative for our members, they are also a great social opportunity to catch up with fellow members in a relaxed environment.

This season we only had 4 new members, with 1 being a transfer from Parramatta Referees (Isaac El-Hassan). Isaac has been a welcome addition to

Our recruitment numbers remain significantly low and are a real concern for the committee. We continue to work with NSWRLRA and CBDJRL to work on recruitment and retention strategies moving forward.

Training & Development

Matthew Gomes was appointed as Training Coordinator for his second season and continues to bring fresh ideas to this area.

This season, the committee introduced a training levy, which was a financial reward given to members who attended 75% of sessions throughout the season. This initiative was well received by active members, and the increased attendance at training allowed Matthew to run more skills and drills inclusive of all members in attendance.

We varied sessions throughout the year, with indoor sessions and a combined session at Cronulla, again well supported by our active members.

Grade - NRL/NSWRL

Adam Gee was once again a consistent performer throughout the NRL season and has confirmed his position as one of the games leading referees.

Some of Adam's achievements throughout the season included:

- Referee Women's State of Origin Game I
- Standby Referee State of Origin Game III
- Referee NRL Finals Week 1, 2 & 3
- Referee NRL Grand Final
- Referee Pacific Cup Final

As mentioned previously in this report, Adam being appointed to referee the NRL Grand Final was an extremely significant appointment and special piece of history for our Association.

Adam became the first Canterbury referee in **42 years** to referee a First Grade Grand Final (the last being Greg Hartley in 1981)

He also became only the **5**th **Canterbury Referee** in history to referee a First-Grade Grand Final following:

- Jack O'Brien 1940, 1942, 1943, 1944, 1947, 1951, 1954
- **Jack Bradley** 1962
- **Keith Holman** 1971
- **Greg Hartley** 1981* Greg refereed 5 Grand Finals, but only 1 as a Canterbury member.

To put that into perspective, we have only had 5 members in over 100 years achieve this feat!

2023 will be hard to top for Adam, but I am sure he will continue to represent himself, his family, and our Association proud. Well done mate!

On the Graded front, we had Nathan Loveday and Jack Bird once again involved in the NSWRL Grade Squad for 2023.

Both members featured regularly across various NSWRL competitions throughout the season, with Nathan achieving a milestone of his own with his appointment as a Touch Judge for the Jersey Flegg Grand Final.

Thank you once again to the Board of NSWRLRA for their support throughout the season, in particular Chairman Kevin Greene, Executive Officer Greg McCallum, and Director of Coaching & Development Steve Clapson.

Social

Our Social Calendar was revamped heading into the 2023 season, with the introduction of our Life Members & Sponsors Luncheon which was held in May and very well attended by Life Members, sponsors, and special guests.

Jabril and Rami were also selected to attend the National U18s Championships in Redcliffe in July, a significant appointment for both members given only 5 members were selected from NSW.

Dear Members,

It is with pleasure that I submit the financial accounts to members for financial year ending 31 October 2023.

Our result for the 12 months to 31 October 2023 was a surplus of \$4,472.83 with our total assets valued at \$33,371.38

Income was once again down during season 2023, compared to the previous year. Our expenses have reduced in 2023 from the previous year, as running costs for CBRA have normalized after the Covid-19 hangover. I also should note that during the 2023 season, our active members lost no weekends due to wet weather, therefore increasing social fees and membership fees we received.

There is always the question of securing income for CBRA, for the benefit of our members and planning for CBRA expenditure, being mindful of our future needs. Whilst we have a healthy surplus for 2023, inflation is potentially the white elephant in the room, we may find ourselves in the next few years, that the costs of goods and services costs increasing more than anticipated and more than expected income to offset these increasing costs.




