Our expanded male and female pathway squads achieved tremendous success throughout the season, and our NRL squad progressed into week two of the finals series, building on the momentum from our 2024 return to finals football.

The success of our pathways programs across both male and female squads demonstrates the strength of our junior development systems—systems that rely on the quality officiating your association provides. Every young player who progresses through our ranks has been guided not just by coaches and parents, but by the referees who teach them respect, discipline, and how to play our game with integrity.

It is with pleasure that I submit the financial accounts to members for financial year ending 31 October 2025

Our result for the 12 months to 31 October 2025 was a loss of **\$7,546.39** with our total assets valued at **\$28,536.80**

Income increased during season 2025 to **\$134,569.77**.

Our expenses have also increased in 2025 from the previous year to **\$142,206.16**.

Changes to reporting and compliance

Members, please note there has been a significant change in the reporting of income and expenditure for season 2025. Now included are referee fees/payments added to profit and loss statements, whilst still detailing other details for income and expenditure.

This change to this financial report provides greater compliance and accounting standards, members would now be aware of the Associations requirements to now lodge annual tax returns to ATO under the new legislated non-for-profit regime.

ATO obligations and update

CBRA completed two Tax Returns during 2025 in meeting our ATO not for profit obligations

FY 2024 – Completed March 2025 (For year ending 30 June 2024)

FY 2025 – Completed October 2025 (For year ending 30 June 2025)

Operational loss

Despite reporting a loss for the period there were one-off payments and payments brought forward as follows.

- Prepayment of Track Suits for season 2026 - **\$4,632** (Net after LRT contribution)
- Professional cost for Not for Profit (compliance administrative changes) **\$1,320** (one off)
- Funeral assistance **\$2,000**
- **Total \$7,592**

Noting our cash loss before depreciation is **\$6,774**, looking forward, there is no reason for income and expenditure to be more balanced beyond 2025.

Active Referee Fees Season 2025

For season 2025, our active referees were advised NSWRL had approved an increase for the payment schedule for active referee payments throughout NSW, which seen a healthy increase across the board (particularly 15-19 age groups).

Charitable donations

CBRA was in a fortunate position to donate \$1,000 for season 2025, the Committee unanimously decided the direction of the CBRA donation should be to **Cure the Future**.

Good friend of the Association, Diane Langmack OAM, was present to receive, on behalf of **Cure The Future**, a cheque for \$1,000 from CBRA at the Leo Randle Meeting in September.

This donation was funded by our active members via sales (at a discounted price) of on-field gear season 2025.

Special mention to Bankstown RSL for making this possible.

Grants

NSWRLRA provided Grants to CBRA for Coaching and Administration totalling **\$3,795**, a slight decrease last year.

Canterbury League Club provides **\$10,000** to the Association via Club Grants, along with Bankstown RSL **\$2,500**.
